An exploration of the historical development of nursing, the evolution of nursing roles, and health care system delivery is presented. The role of the professional nurse and the scope of practice are examined. Introduction to core health care professional competencies and concepts related to nursing practice concepts are introduced. The philosophy, conceptual framework, and program outcomes of the nursing program are introduced. An emphasis on the acquisition of basic knowledge of social justice, ethical values, holistic care, respect for diversity, human dignity, and altruism is included.
